NATURAL DRUGS FROM DAILY LIFE

Plants have been always used as medicines by mankind to treat health-threatening diseases. It is the oldest medical practice for humans and 80% of developing countries rely on traditional medicines, mainly composing herbal prescriptions. With the development of modern medicinal systems natural products are been left out due to their slower rate of action for therapeutic and diagnostic operations. But due to their natural origin these drugs are the safest option with least or no side effects.

Some natural drugs are not appreciated as they are never administered as medicines but shows great effects. From tea to the spices in our kitchens, the vegetables to simple condiments in our refrigerator every natural food and beverage has enough phyto-constituents to treat thousands of diseases. Ginger tea have so many volatile oils, tannins and caffiene which can be very helpful for CNS stimulation and improvement in digestion. A simple sugar and salt solutions can help in case of severe hypotension and studies shows that there is a modest reduction in blood pressure on intake of soyabean in daily diet which can be used as a minor preventive measure for hypertension.

Turmeric has many properties such as antiseptic, potential to prevent heart diseases, Alzheimer's disease and neoplasticity. Asafoetida (heeng) and bishop's weed (ajwain) helps in improving digestion. Many citrus fruits has antioxidants which help in strenthening our immune system.

With modern discoveries in allopathy, treatment of diseases is becoming a swift process but has its own cons like increase chances of severe side-effects and even life threatening adverse reactions in body which increases risk factor and degradation of general health of population.

As natural products are much safer and does need much economical and educative resources for production it is abundantly accessible to general population. Which is making medicinal science going back to the systems which were introduced in ancient times derived from natural origin like Ayurveda, Unani and Sidha system of medicines. It will indulge more people in growing plants with increased demand by commercial field of medicinal science as there will be more earning opportunities with least educative and scientific skills. From every aspect it is clear that going back to nature will be beneficial for mankind and for the planet.


